NOTE: This *Guide* covers the art & architecture of the late Roman Empire, divided into the Greek-speaking Eastern (Byzantine) Empire (4th to 15th centuries), and the Latin-speaking Western Empire (through its collapse in the 5th century, and up to its displacement by Charlemagne in the 8th century). Some material overlaps with Kappe Library *Guides* #79 *Greece & Rome* and #81 *Carolingian, Romanesque & Gothic*.
