

FIND ARTICLES IN MAGAZINES

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MAGAZINES AT THE KAPPE LIBRARY

There are currently 100+ subscriptions, and over 3000 bound volumes. Titles reflect the range of curriculum, from architecture to general interest publications.

To determine if the library owns a specific magazine issue, check the 3-ring binder *PERIODICALS IN THE COLLECTION* (kept next to the index workstations). Magazines may reside in three places: the newest issues appear on the new magazine display, older issues are hardbound and shelved in alphabetical order by title, and miscellaneous single issues of other magazines are stored in the office area. If you can't find the magazine you're looking for ask staff for help.

Flipping through magazines is fun, but it is not the way to research. It is slow, and unlikely to lead you to all the articles that you need. You can use The Avery Index to locate articles systematically.

The *Avery* is the most important tool for architectural research.

In one step you can search centuries of articles published in over 1,000 architectural magazines published worldwide. Records date from the 1700s up to last year.

THE AVERY INDEX TO ARCHITECTURAL PERIODICALS

REMINDER. Avery is available only at the 2 designated workstations, so please be considerate of other users.

ACCESSING. If the Avery screen isn't open, click on the desktop icon.

SEARCHING.

- At the top of the screen begins the list of fields you may search in.
- The first field, KEYWORDS/PHASES is a good place to start.
- If you use multiple keywords in one field, put "AND" or "&" or "+" between each term.
- Push ENTER and your results will appear in a new screen, arranged most recent to oldest.

RESULTS

- Results appear in brief citation format. Select DISPLAY: FULL RECORD to get the full text of each record.

- Each record contains useful information.

Besides author, title, magazine name and date of specific issue the article appears in, the record identifies, for example, length and kinds of illustrations--facts which can influence your decision whether or not it is worthwhile to retrieve the article.

- Click PRINT to print. Click RECORDS and EXPORT to save to desktop
- Click "CLEAR SEARCH" to start over.

REFINE YOUR SEARCH. You can do a search with keywords in different fields.

For example, you can type "DETAILS" in the ILLUSTRATION field to limit your search to articles that contain drawings of details

OTHER INDEXES

THE ARCHITECTURAL INDEX, R-NA1.A7 1950-2003

The *Architectural Index* indexes U.S. architectural magazines only, and is useful for finding articles published between 1951 and 1977. Often it includes articles that do not appear in Avery

THE ARCHITECTURAL PERIODICAL INDEX, Reference-NA---1.A1A69 1980-1995, 1997

Produced by the Royal Institute of British Architects, the *Architectural Periodical Index* indexes international architectural magazines, with an emphasis on Britain and Europe. A partial version is also available at <http://site.yahoo.net/riba-library/index.html>.

Medline, from the National Library of Medicine, the world's leading database of bibliographic records in the biomedical and life sciences.

ONLINE NEWSPAPERS.COM, <http://www.onlinenewspapers.com/>

Comprehensive, searchable database of world newspaper web sites. Most newspaper web sites permit searching of past articles.

INGENTA, <http://www.ingenta.com/>

(1988-) Ingenta provides keyword access to information from the tables of Description of over 17,000 journals, listing over 7 million articles which have appeared since 1988. UnCover includes periodicals from all subject areas, but concentrates heavily on the sciences and social sciences. Copies of journal articles faxed to you within 24 hours. The charge per article can be steep (usually \$7 plus a copyright fee of \$6 to \$15) but searching the database is free. Need credit card and fax number.

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
